#### **Weather and Outdoor Activities**

San Luis Obispo is known for its sunny and temperate climate; however, the weather can be quite changeable. During October, the average daily temperature is about 75° but it can get up to 100° or down to 50°. The nighttime average temperature is about 55° but it can be warmer or cooler. We have not had any rain for a while, but rain is not out of the question.

Most of the presentations and all meals will be held indoors. We are planning to have Dave Foreman's fireside chat and the concert in the outdoor amphitheater, which is equipped with wooden benches. Participants may bring lawn chairs and / or blankets. The Pennington Creek nature walk is, of course, an outside activity. Please wear hiking boots or sturdy shoes for the nature walk.

We suggest wearing layered clothing so you will be comfortable in both hot and cold weather, inside or out.

#### No Pets

Rancho El Chorro has a strict no pet policy. If you plan to bring a service animal, please contact us ahead of time so we can obtain approval on your behalf.
