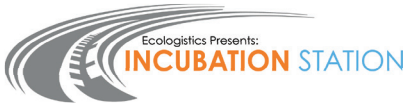




Ecologistics Mission:

Grant Success

Ecologistics was the recipient of two grants in 2021 – California Relief Grant in the amount of \$15,000 and grant from the City of San Luis Obispo Promotional Coordinating Committee of \$4,000 for assistance in putting on the 2022 Central Coast Bioneers Conference.

In addition to our grants, our industrious sponsored organizations scored several grants of their own.

Fiscal Sponsorship

And speaking of sponsored organizations, Ecologistics' fiscal sponsorship program grew by another seven organizations in 2021: At Her Table, Community Roots Project, SLO Food System Coalition, Oceano Economic Development Council, Seed to Belly, and Run on Climate Education Fund. Ecologistics was excited to adopt its first international organization, Mt. Elgon Ecosystem Trust, headquartered in Kenya. This brings the total at the end of 2021 to 37 organizations under the Ecologistics umbrella.
